[42 U.S.C. 621] The purpose of this subpart is to promote State flexibility in the development and expansion of a coordinated child and family services program that utilizes community-based agencies and ensures all children are raised in safe, loving families, by—</p> <p>(1) protecting and promoting the welfare of all children;</p> <p>(2) preventing the neglect, abuse, or exploitation of children;</p> <p>(3) supporting at-risk families through services which allow children, where appropriate, to remain safely with their families or return to their families in a timely manner;</p> <p>(4) promoting the safety, permanence, and well-being of children in foster care and adoptive families; and</p> <p>(5) providing training,</p>	<p>Sec. 431. [42 U.S.C. 629a] (a) In General.—As used in this subpart:</p> <p>(1) Family preservation services.—The term “family preservation services” means services for children and families designed to help families (including adoptive and extended families) at risk or in crisis, including—</p> <p>(A) service programs designed to help children—</p> <p>(i) where safe and appropriate, return to families from which they have been removed; or</p> <p>(ii) be placed for adoption, with a legal guardian, or, if adoption or legal guardianship is determined not to be safe and appropriate for a child, in some other planned, permanent living arrangement;</p> <p>(B) preplacement preventive services programs, such as intensive family preservation programs, designed to help children at risk of foster care placement remain safely with</p>	<p>(2) Family support services.—The term “family support services” means community-based services to promote the safety and well-being of children and families designed to increase the strength and stability of families (including adoptive, foster, and extended families), to increase parents' confidence and competence in their parenting abilities, to afford children a safe, stable, and supportive family environment, to strengthen parental relationships and promote healthy marriages, and otherwise to enhance child development.</p>	<p>(7)Time-limited family reunification services.—</p> <p>(A) In general.—The term “time-limited family reunification services” means the services and activities described in subparagraph (B) that are provided to a child that is removed from the child's home and placed in a foster family home or a child care institution and to the parents or primary caregiver of such a child, in order to facilitate the reunification of the child safely and appropriately within a timely fashion, but only during the 15-month period that begins on the date that the child, pursuant to section 475(5)(F), is considered to have entered foster care.</p> <p>(B) Services and activities described.—The services and activities described in this subparagraph are the following:</p>	<p>(8) Adoption promotion and support services.— The term “adoption promotion and support services” means services and activities designed to encourage more adoptions out of the foster care system, when adoptions promote the best interests of children, including such activities as pre- and post-adoptive services and activities designed to expedite the adoption process and support adoptive families.</p>	<p>4) contains assurances that not more than 10 percent of expenditures under the plan for any fiscal year with respect to which the State is eligible for payment under section 434 for the fiscal year shall be for administrative costs</p>
