**Needed Services for Performance-Based Contracting (Phase I)  
Recommended by Charlotte McCullough and Mary Armstrong**

NOTES:

- Services listed below do not include Investigation and Case Management, as those are to be done by CA in Phase I.
- \* Indicates services that would satisfy federal or state mandatory service requirements.
- The Contractor would generally link with allied systems to access the shaded services, rather than fund the service with resources from the contract with CA.

<b>Intake &amp; Care Coordination &amp; Planning</b>
Intake services (i.e., the 24/7 capacity to accept & respond immediately to CA referrals, <u>NOT</u> CPS Intake)
Care coordination (including Information & Referral)
Service planning (partnering with CA and C/F to connect the C/F with individualized services to meet identified needs)
<b>Family Focused Services to Protect Children, Prevent Placement and/or Promote Reunification</b>
*Safety plan & family support services (CPS - ARS) for low-to moderate risk families
* Intensive family preservation services
* Solution-focused, short-term family services/supports (i.e. Functional Family Therapy)
* Infants/ toddlers/ early childhood intervention
*In-home day or weekend respite (for birth, foster, adoptive, relative caregivers)
Truancy prevention, afterschool programs, educational support
*Parent education and support such as Parent/Child Interaction Therapy
Daily living skill-building support
*Crisis stabilization/in-home crisis response
Family-to-family support (support groups, mentors for birth, relative, foster, and adoptive parents)
Mentoring (for children/youth)
Legal assistance (birth, relative, youth)
Stress and anger management
*Domestic violence prevention/intervention
Household/financial management

Housing assistance (section 8, transitional, etc)
Income eligibility assistance
Health care and nutritional support
Pregnancy prevention/intervention
* Child care (birth, foster, adoptive, relative caregivers)
Treatment child care
*Visitation services/supports
*Individual, family, or group counseling
Interpreter services
*Transportation
Emergency Flex Funds-Basic Needs (funds for utilities, rent, etc.)
Developmental disability services
*Family finding/engagement (Fostering Connections and ICWA)
In-home & community-based services supports for medically fragile children/youth
In-home nursing services/supports
*Reunification & aftercare services (including BRS)
<b>Child &amp; Family Health and Behavioral Health Screens / Assessment &amp; Services</b>
*Health/medical and dental screens/assessments and supportive services
*Substance abuse/drug and mental health screening/ assessments for child/youth and/or parents and supportive services
* Early childhood developmental assessment and supportive services
Assessment/treatment of sexually aggressive youth
Medication management
HIV/AIDS testing/treatment
Developmental disability or neurological assessment and supportive services
*Educational assessment and supportive services
<b>Placement Services and Supports</b>
*Recruitment, orientation, training, and support of foster families (general and targeted diligent recruitment)
Pre-placement assessment (to improve match)
Placement stabilization services/supports
*Emergency Shelter Care – Family-based
Emergency Shelter/Assessment Center -Facility

*Unlicensed relative care and supports
*Licensed relative care and supports
*Traditional family foster care
Traditional family foster care with BRS wrap/overlay services
*Treatment/medically fragile foster and group homes
Runaway/homeless youth shelter /services
*Preparation for adult living- skill building
*IL housing-campus and community-based
*Educational training vouchers
*Respite care (for foster, adoptive, relative caregivers)
Recreational and summer programs
*Pre- and post adoptive services/supports
